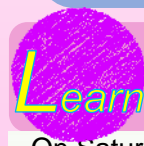


Blue patrol squad "Aiming for safe and secure town" !



On Wednesday, March 6, 2024, we invited Toyohashi Police Station personnel to the Iwata Precinct Civic Center and received guidance on how to prepare for activities in the new fiscal year, points of focus for patrols, etc.

The Iwata Precinct Voluntary Crime Prevention Patrol Blue Patrol Squad operates with 58 members and 27 registered vehicles. In 2020, a total of 220 blue patrol vehicles were dispatched to patrol the school district. In joint patrols with the Children's Watch Team, we patrolled the school district with Iwata Elementary School teachers, PTA members, crime prevention committee members, and members of the Rehabilitation Protection Women's Association to watch over the children.



Creating a comfortable life Executive committee inspection training



On Saturday, March 16, 2020, we visited Toyokawa City and learned how neighborhood association activities have changed with the use of the digital circulation system "Yui Net". 14 committee members have been training together with the Toyohashi City Citizen Collaboration Promotion Division.



On the day, we heard from Norie Kamiya, representative director of the NPO Honokuni Machizukuri Network, and Toyokawa City Citizen Collaboration International Division Manager Matsumoto, and exchanged opinions on the future of community association activities.
